# Some gentle reminders...

The school day begins at 8.50 a.m. Please ensure your children are in school on time every morning.

Please note that we will not be responsible for children arriving before 8:50 a.m.

- For the first week, Junior Infants will be collected at 12pm.
- From Thursday, 4<sup>th</sup> September, Junior Infants will be collected at 1:30pm.
- Senior Infants will be collected at 1:30pm.
- Pupils from 1<sup>st</sup> Class 6<sup>th</sup> Class will be collected at 2:30pm.

Please ensure that you arrive on time to collect your children. If you are late, it can make your child very anxious.

# **Arriving to school**

- This year everyone will come in through the front main gate and line up on their lines.
- We encourage a drop and go system for all.

# Home-time

- The same routine as last year remains in place.
- Pupils from Junior Infants to 3<sup>rd</sup> Class will line up on their lines at the front gate.
- The teacher will dismiss each child as they see their parent.

# **Parking**

There is reserved parking outside the school for our school buses. Please do not park in these spaces at any time. Parents can parallel park along the footpath at the front of the school or in the hall car park to the back of the school.

#### Permission to walk/cycle home

If your child is in  $4^{th} - 6^{th}$  class and you feel your child is responsible enough to walk home, please complete the permission slip on Aladdin.

# **Early Collection**

If you need to collect your child early from school for any reason, please notify us, where possible, at least a day in advance by ringing or emailing the school to let us know. You will need to sign your child out upon collection.

#### Absences

If your child is unwell or unable to attend school, please fill in the reason on your Aladdin app. The school is required by law to report unexplained absences, frequent absences or late arrivals to school to the Education Welfare Office, who will investigate the report.

# Handle with care

If your child is coming to school after a difficult night, morning or weekend please email the school 'Handle with Care'. This will let us know that your child may need extra time, patience and help during the day.

# <u>New Primary Maths Curriculum –</u> Now Fully Implemented

We're excited to share that the new Primary Maths Curriculum is now being fully implemented across all class levels from this school year onward.

This updated curriculum places a strong problem-solving, emphasis on mathematical thinking, and real-life application, helping children develop a deeper understanding of maths everyday contexts. It also encourages hands-on learning, collaboration, and critical thinking, making maths more engaging and meaningful for all learners. We look forward to working together to support your child's mathematical development under this new and modern approach. # **Mobile Phones and other devices**

It is school policy for pupils not to have a mobile phone or personal electronic devices at school; however, the school understands that in some cases a pupil may have a valid reason for needing a mobile phone. Therefore, all pupils who need to have a mobile at school must fill in a permission slip stating the reasons why they need a phone at school. Please let us know if you would like us to send you the permission slip. The school does not take any responsibility for the safe keeping or care of pupils' phones. Phones must be switched off and stay in pupils' bags during school hours. Mobile phones cannot be taken on school excursions or camps. iPod touch, smart watch or any other form of handheld game or music player must not be brought into school. Parents will be contacted if these protocols are not followed.

# **School Office Hours & Phone Calls**

Please note that our secretary's working hours are from 9:30am to 12:00pm.

To help us protect valuable teaching and learning time, we kindly ask that phone calls to the school be limited to the following times, unless it is an emergency:

- 8:30am 8:50am
- 9:30am 12:00pm
- After 2:30pm

As a teaching principal, stepping out of the classroom to answer calls between 12:00pm and 2:30pm can disrupt lessons. We appreciate your understanding and support in helping us prioritise our pupils' learning.

# Change of Address/ Emergency Numbers/ Email Addresses

If you have changed any of these or your standby contacts, we would ask that you change these on your Aladdin app. This information is necessary for the safety and care of your child during school hours.

# **Possessions**

Please ensure all clothing and other possessions are clearly labelled with indelible ink. If there is no label, it will be donated to charity.

#### **School Uniform**

A sky-blue polo shirt and official school jumper/sweatshirt are compulsory for all children every day. The sky-blue polo shirt and school jumper can be ordered from the school office. Black footwear must be worn (runners permitted).

Navy school trousers, skirt, pinafore must be worn. These can be sourced from Dunnes Stores, Penneys, Marks and Spencer, Tesco or other retail outlets. Leggings and branded bottoms are not permitted. Navy tracksuit bottoms and runners must be worn on P.E days.

# **PE Days**

Navy tracksuit bottoms and runners must be worn on P.E days. Your child's class teacher will send a message on Aladdin to let you know when your child's P.E day is.

#### Milk

We're pleased to offer the option of school milk again this year. A permission slip will be sent out shortly via Aladdin for those who wish to sign up.

# **School packed lunch**

Children must bring a healthy lunch to school – no fizzy drinks, no sweets, no frubes, and no crisps allowed. We are a

Plastic Free and Healthy Eating School, so we expect re-usable lunch boxes and drink bottles. No plastic straws. Children should bring water to drink — no juice/smoothie cartons please. Milk is available to order daily through the school.

We would appreciate your cooperation with implementing all of the above in helping to maintain a healthy school environment.

# Hot & Cold Lunches - Ongoing Update

We are currently working on securing hot or cold lunch options for our pupils through the Department of Education's school meals programme. Our aim is to nutritious. provide balanced. sustainable meals that support students' health and learning. However, sourcing a supplier who can consistently meet the required standards has proven challenging. We are continuing our efforts to find a provider who can offer healthy, appealing, and environmentally responsible meals for all children.

We appreciate your patience and will keep you updated on any progress. Thank you for your continued support as we work toward a solution that benefits the whole school community.

#### **Schoolbooks**

you are aware, the cost of schoolbooks, workbooks and copies is now funded by the Department of Education. Pupils from Junior Infants to 2<sup>nd</sup> Class can write into their workbooks. However, pupils from 3<sup>rd</sup> Class to 6<sup>th</sup> Class are not permitted to write into their books. Textbooks have been provided on loan to children for the duration of the 2025/2026 school year and textbooks will be returned in June as they remain property of the school. I am asking you to remind your children to please take care of their books and keep them in good condition during the year.

#### **School Charge**

As mentioned in last year's newsletter, an annual charge of €80 per pupil will be applied via the Aladdin platform for this school year. This contribution helps cover essential costs such as pupil insurance, supplies, photocopying, school materials. and interactive licences/programmes including Mathletics and Dabbledoo, along with other educational supports that directly enhance students' learning experiences.
