Head Lice

There is already a case of head lice in the school. Please be vigilant in checking your children's hair weekly and informing the school immediately if you suspect your child has head lice, so that we can alert other parents. If you do detect head lice, please treat accordingly with medicated treatments and "nit combs". Ask pharmacists for advice as to what treatments would suit your child. Sometimes, one treatment is not enough and it can easily re-occur. There are numerous treatments one can use. The Headlice Experts are particularly good at identifying and eradicating head lice. Please note all hair longer than shoulder length must be tied back. In our school, Monday night is head lice checking night, please treat this as part of your child's homework.
