We are delighted to share that the children in 2nd and 3rd Class will be learning French in Term 2! We're very fortunate to have a proficient French-speaking teacher on staff – Ms. Hadden – who will be delivering these lessons after Christmas. This is a wonderful opportunity for the children to be introduced to a new language in a fun and engaging way.

In addition, we're pleased to let you know that the school has secured a small grant to invest in new school resources, further supporting our commitment to enriching the learning experience for all students.

School packed lunch

Children must bring a healthy lunch to school – no fizzy drinks, no sweets, no frubes, and no crisps allowed. We are a Plastic Free and Healthy Eating School, so we expect re-usable lunch boxes and drink bottles. No plastic straws. Children should bring water to drink – no juice/smoothie cartons please. Milk is available to order daily through the school.

We would appreciate your cooperation with all of the above in helping to maintain a healthy school environment.

Absences

If your child is unwell or unable to attend school, please record the reason for their absence using the Aladdin app. To be marked present for the day, a pupil must attend school for at least 2.5 hours. By law, the school is required to report any unexplained absences, frequent absences, or

regular late arrivals to the Education Welfare Office, which may lead to further investigation.
