Friendship Week – Celebrating Kindness and Connection

Last week, our school came together to celebrate Friendship Week, focusing on kindness, gratitude, and the joy of friendship. It was wonderful to see so many smiling faces and caring actions across every class!

We kicked off the week with a special assembly and paired up buddies, encouraging pupils to connect with someone new and support one another throughout the week. Heritage Schools with Sonia Caldwell, Ms Curtin's Class

On Thursday, we were delighted to welcome Sonya Caldwell, who shared her wonderful knowledge of nature with the classes. The children brought in interesting leaves to create a colourful *nature table*, and Sonya taught us all kinds of fascinating facts — including how you can make soap from horse chestnuts! We even used dye made from oak leaves to paint some beautiful artwork.

Heritage Schools with Sonia Caldwell, Ms Hadden's Class

Over the past few weeks, 2nd and 3rd Class have been working with Sonia Caldwell, local West Cork artist on an exciting project exploring the theme of river habitats. The children have spent time observing pond life up close, watching tiny creatures swimming and learning about the delicate ecosystems that thrive in our local waterways. Inspired by what they've seen, they have been experimenting with natural dyes made from local plants and rocks to create beautiful artwork. As part of the project, the classes have also been making their own paper from pulp and using iPads to create stop-motion animations that bring their ideas to life. There's one more full workshop day to come, and we can't wait to see the final collaborative piece that will showcase all their hard work and creativity!

Skipping Around the World!

The whole school has been taking part in the *Skip Around the World* challenge, adding fun movement breaks into our days. It's wonderful to see the yard full of children skipping, laughing, and staying active together. Some pupils have even been inspired by the skipping videos and are busy practising some very creative pair-skipping routines — there's plenty of impressive teamwork and fancy footwork on display!

If your child is unwell or unable to attend school, please record the reason for their absence using the Aladdin app. To be marked present for the day, a pupil must attend school for at least 2.5 hours. By law, the school is required to report any unexplained absences, frequent absences, or regular late arrivals to the Education Welfare Office, which may lead to further investigation.
